

Welcome to the River Glen

The River Glen rises in the Lincolnshire Limestone Ridge east of Grantham with the navigation beginning at Tongue End, near Bourne. The River Glen travels through the Fen landscape passing through several villages before it meets the tidal Welland at Surfleet Seas End. Most of the channel upstream of Pinchbeck is shallow and only suitable for light craft and canoes.

Important information

Speed limit

A speed limit of 11.2 kmph (7 mph) applies throughout the navigation. However, care must be taken at all times in the interests of safety and to protect the water environment and wildlife.

Moorings

Boats must not be moored within 36 m (118 ft) of any lock, sluice, weir or water intake, except when navigating through a lock.

Tidal passage

The river becomes tidal at the confluence with the Welland at Surfleet Seas End. Registered craft should arrange passage through Surfleet Sluice by contacting the River Inspector on (07721) 390128 / (01522) 513100.

Warning: There is a strong run on the flood and ebb tides on the tidal Welland and craft should avoid these periods.

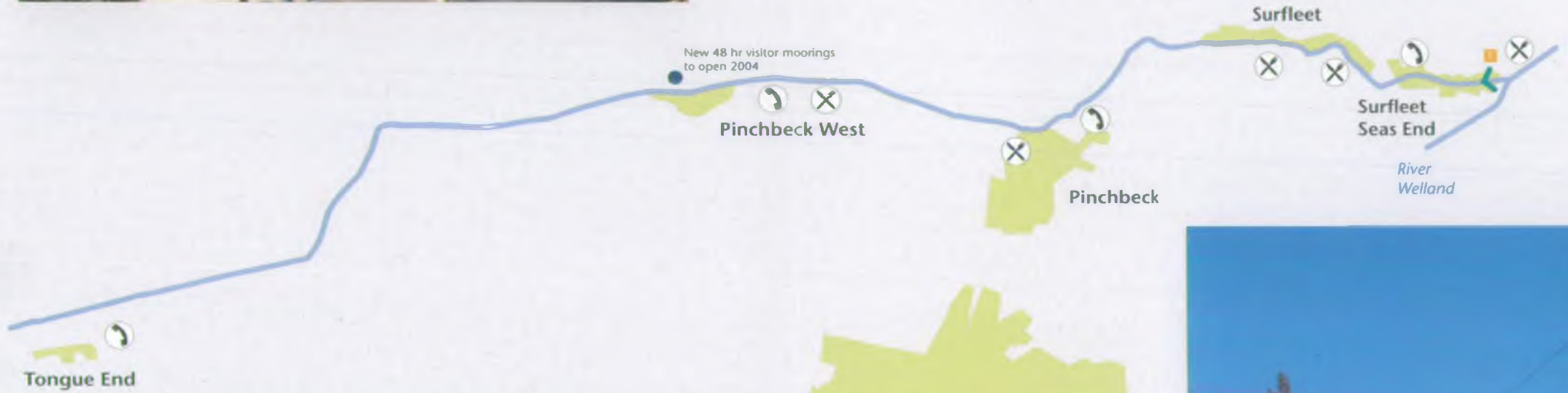
Maximum Craft Size

Lowest restriction headroom 1.9m
(Not guaranteed. Based on normal water level. See Note)

Surfleet - Tongue End

Lock **Surfleet Seas End Sluice** 19km/4hrs 45mins
(Boat access only when tidal and freshwater levels equal).
Passage by appointment telephone the River Inspector
(07721) 390128 / (01522) 513100.

It would take approximately 4hrs 45mins to travel the 19km from Surfleet Lock to Tongue End in a boat travelling at 4 kmph.
