"The North Wessex area clearly demonstrates the wide range of contrasting environmental issues facing the Agency. The area covers the historic county of Somerset, parts of south Gloucestershire and north west Wiltshire, and includes the major cities of Bristol and Bath. Contrasting features include the internationally important conservation areas of the Severn Estuary and the Somerset Levels and Moors, together with centres of major industry such as the Avonmouth industrial complex.

The role of the Agency is not only to safeguard and maintain the quality of the environment we live in, but through working with others ensure that there is a significant and sustained improvement in the environment for future generations.

There are so many issues of interest in the area. For example, there are three nuclear power stations on the Severn Estuary, at Hinkley Point, Oldbury and Berkeley. Inland, agriculture and horticulture are crucial to the economy of the area. There are also many unique and important local industries.

'Our success in delivering significant environmental improvements is critically dependent upon working with the people who live and work in North Wessex including local communities, industry, agriculture, local authorities and environmental interests.
