DO I NEED TO REGISTER?

You must register as a carrier if in the course of your business or in any other way for profit you transport controlled waste within Great Britain.

You must register even if you transport controlled waste only once in a while. The requirement to register applies to self-employed carriers as well as partnerships and companies.

WHY DO I NEED TO REGISTER?

Since 1 April 1992 it has been an offence to transport controlled waste if you are not a registered carrier. You can be stopped and your vehicle can be searched.

If stopped, you will be required to produce your certificate of registration. If you are not registered, you can be fined up to $\pounds 5,000$. If you decide to apply for registration after being convicted, your application could be refused.

If you are not registered, it is also an offence for anyone else to give their waste to you.

HOW MUCH DOES REGISTRATION COST?

Registration currently costs £95 for the initial three year period. Renewal of registration after the initial three year period currently costs £65 for a further three years.

If you are already registered as a waste broker, registration as a carrier costs £25.

Once your application is accepted your registration will be valid throughout Great Britain and will last for three years.

ARE THERE ANY EXCEPTIONS?

Yes. You do not need to be registered as a carrier if

- you are a householder carrying your own domestic waste (eg to your civic amenity site), or
- you are a charity, or
- you are a voluntary organisation, or
- you transport only waste which you have produced, except building and demolition waste.

Note:

- if the waste you produce is building or demolition waste you must be registered in order to transport it yourself.
- if you are a charity or voluntary organisation and you transport waste, you must instead be registered in your environment agency's register of waste transporters. This is free of charge

If you are in any doubt, check with your environment agency: see the panel FURTHER INFORMATION AND ADVICE on the back of this leaflet. Do not assume that any of these exceptions apply to you.

HOW DO I APPLY FOR REGISTRATION?

Ask your environment agency for an application form. For where to ask, see the panel FURTHER INFORMATION AND ADVICE on the back of this leaflet.

CAN REGISTRATION BE REFUSED?

Yes, but only

- if you do not make your application as the rules require, or you have been convicted of certain offences (or another person connected with your business has been so convicted) and the agency considers it undesirable that you should be registered.
- If your application is refused, you have a right of appeal against the agency's decision.

WHAT IS CONTROLLED WASTE?

Controlled Waste is any kind of household, commercial or industrial waste. It includes any waste from a house, shop, office, factory or any other trade or business premises.

It includes unwanted surplus substances, building or demolition waste and anything which is disposed of as broken, worn out, contaminated or spoiled in some other way.

It is Controlled Waste whether it is liquid or solid waste and even if it is not hazardous or toxic.

Currently waste from farms, mines and quarries is not Controlled Waste. However, the legal status of some of these wastes will change in due course.

WHO ARE THE REGISTRATION AUTHORITIES?

In England and Wales; the Environment Agency

In Scotland; your regional office of the Scottish Environment Protection Agency (SEPA)

WHAT IF I AM A WASTE BROKER?

If you arrange for the collection, recovery or disposal of waste on behalf of another person, you may also need to be registered as a waste broker.
