ALGAE SEVAGE?

HELPING YOU TO TELL THE DIFFERENCE

ALGAE - easily mistaken for sewage - regularly affects our shores during warmer weather.

A creamy-brown coloured foamy slick of the common algae Phaeocystis can be carried inshore by tides and winds. And when washed up the algae is often wrongly identified as sewage.

Although visually unpleasant Phaeocystis is not toxic.

Some examples of Phaeocystis are shown here.
