

- 2. Interviews took place on the following days:

Sun 2nd September

- 3. Each site was surveyed over a total of six days, except Lydbrooke and Rhayader which were only surveyed twice, over both weekdays and weekends.
- 4. Interviews took place between 10 am and 7 pm.
- 5. Respondents were selected at random as they passed one of the survey positions at each site. The next person to pass by following completion of the previous survey was approached for interview. Those visiting the site on business, or not using the site for recreational purposes were not interviewed.
- 6. Interviews were carried out by Conservation Training Wales, under contract to the River Wye Project.
- 7. The data was analysed by Hereford and Worcester County Council on behalf of the Project, using SPSS.

Results

Due to the open nature of the questions, the completed questionnaire was not suitable for analysis by computer. Neither was it was it appropriate to use sophisticated statistical techniques. Analysis was undertaken manually and entailed noting the frequency with which particular answers were given. Each time a similar point was raised by the respondent it was recorded. Failure to answer a question was also recorded. Using this method there was no limit to the number of points recorded in reply to each question. Each point raised was given equal weighting.

Using this analysis, the total number of times a particular issue, problem or suggestion was mentioned can be regarded as an indicator of its significance and the strength of feeling among fishery owners. The full results are contained in tables 1 - 7. These show:-

- 1) The overall frequency distribution of each answer.
- 2) The frequency distribution, expressed as a percentage of the total number of replies received.
- 3) The frequency distribution for each stretch of river.
- 4) The frequency distribution, expressed as a percentage of the total number of replies received for each section of river, for those answers which constitute greater than 10% of the total.

Only questions 15 to 21 were analysed in this way. Questions 1 - 14 were essentially intended to provide reference information and are not covered by this report.

Ouestion 15

Q. How would you describe the current recreational use of the River Wye as a whole? In your experience, has their been any change in the pattern of recreation use over the past ten years?

The general consensus among fishery owners appears to be that there has been an overall increase in recreational use over the past ten years. The most significant finding from this question was the very high percentage of owners who felt that there had been a growth in canoeing and rafting; 64.5% and 40% respectively. Other uses which were specifically mentioned as having increased were angling (8.2%) and walking (6.4%). 10% said that there had been an increase in general river use but did not specify how the use had changed. 8.2% of owners thought that there had been no change in the level of activity, though perhaps significantly these were all from upstream of Hereford where recreation pressures are not so intensive as further downstream.

In terms of navigation, very few owners thought that there had been a growth in powered craft, despite the concerns expressed in the past by some angling representatives about jet-skis. This did not appear to be a view shared by the majority of owners. 10.9% of respondents did not answer this question.

Ouestion 16

Q. Have you experienced any conflicts or problems with other river users or riparian owners on your stretch of river? If so, please give details.

Most significantly perhaps, 25.4% of owners stated that they had not experienced any problems, though the percentage of those that had was higher below Ross. Only 4.5% did not reply to this question. Of the remaining 70.1%, the most common problems were associated with navigation. Navigation appears to impact on fishery owning interests in a number of ways and would appear to be a major concern. Most of these problems are centred on canoeing and rafting. These two activities appear to give rise to a range of distinct problems and conflicts, which some owners consider affect the quality of the fishing and/or their enjoyment of the sport.

The most frequently expressed problems concerned the general disturbance to fish and fishing (14.5%), undisciplined or irresponsible behaviour (10.9%) and the unauthorised launching and landing of canoes (13.6%). Other concerns included the large size of some canoeing groups, noise, and general disturbance.

The problems created by rafts are many and varied; but were not so frequently cited as those involving canoes. This may reflect differences in the participation levels of the two sports. Problems experienced included rafts disturbing fishing, noise, and nuisance caused by the followers of raft races. However, no individual rafting related problem was mentioned by more than 10% of owners.

Only one owner reported problems with jet-skis, and none powered craft; other than two owners who mentioned problems caused by a single large barge.

Other more general problems included trespass, vandalism and litter, though these were not encountered by large numbers of owners and do not appear to be regarded as a widespread problem.

Question 17

Q. If and where appropriate on your stretch of river, do you have any views on how the management of navigation might be improved?

It was expected that this question would reveal strong opinions among fishery owners. It was therefore surprising that 7.3% did not answer this question and 20.9% stated that they had no suggestions. However a wide range of viewpoints and suggestions were forthcoming from those that did reply.

Of these, the most frequently mentioned suggestion was that a licensing system should be introduced to cover all craft using the river (23.6%). Linked to this, 15.4% felt that all navigation should be required to make some form of financial payment as a condition of using the river.

A significant number of owners felt that some success could be achieved by voluntary means, including 15.4% who wanted better information to be provided to users, such as the publication of a code of conduct.

A proportion of owners felt that there should be restrictions on certain types of craft using the river, most notably powered craft and jet-skis. Others (4.5%) favoured the introduction of speed limits.

In addition to these general suggestions, several suggestions aimed specifically at regulating canoeing and rafting were put forward. There was no clear consensus as to what form this regulation should take or how it could be achieved. Suggestions included limiting the number of canoes (7.3%), controlling access points (7.3%), and restricting the times when rafts are allowed on the river.

Ouestion 18

Q. What role do you think that anglers and fishery owners can play inincreasing the overall enjoyment of the river and alleviating any problems or conflicts?

A very high proportion of owners (51.8%) either did not answer this question or had no constructive suggestions to make. A further 10% stated that they did not think that anglers or fishery owners had a role to play in alleviating problems or conflicts, arguing that they are at the receiving end of problems caused by others.

Of those that did acknowledge that anglers and fishery owners had a role to play, the largest number (16.3%) felt that they could help by being more tolerant and understanding of others; though none suggested particular mechanisms by which this would be achieved. Some owners, largely those upstream of Hay, felt that some problems could be resolved by allowing more cance access, by agreement.

Question 19

Q. Do you think that there is a need to improve the opportunities for recreation along the Wye? If so, which of the following do you think could be improved, and how?

A very high percentage, 48%, thought that there was no need to improve the opportunities for informal recreation. A large number opposed any improvements, believing that they would have a detrimental impact on their interests and on the environment. A further 15.4% did not answer this question.

Although there was little outright support for improving the recreation use of the river, several owners felt that they could support new proposals if they were properly planned and managed and were of a scale compatible with the area. Their opposition was to the continuation of what they regarded as the uncontrolled expansion of use that is occurring at present. There was some support for each of the categories of recreation facilities suggested in the question, again provided they were properly planned.

Question 20

Q. Is there anything which you feel could be done to improve fishing on the Wye or increase your enjoyment of the sport?

A great many suggestions were put forward which owners believed would improve the quality of fishing. Most of these were concerned with protecting and developing the fishery (control of poaching, fish stocking, bait restrictions, etc.) and improvements to water quality and quantity. Most of these suggestions were not linked to other forms of recreation and are to a large extent outside the terms of reference of the Wye Project. 21.8% did not answer this question.

In terms of recreation management, the only relevant suggestions concerned navigation. 17.3% of respondents considered that the control of navigation should be improved.

Ouestion 21

Q. Are there any other comments or suggestions which you would like to make?

Very few owners had any additional, relevant comments or suggestions to make. 52.7% of owners either did not answer this question, or stated that they had no comments to make. The only significant point of interest was that 15.5% of owners thought that it was unfair that they (anglers) were the only group of users that contributed financially to the river and effectively had to pay for their recreation. There appeared to be a level of resentment that other users, notably navigation interests, do not also have to pay.

Conclusions

The questionnaire proved to be an effective method of canvassing the opinions of fishery owners. Although the analysis is to a large extent subjective and the results are by no means scientific, they do provide a good indication of the views of Wye fishery owners on a variety of topics. To an extent, the results do not need to be elaborated on and the conclusions are self evident. However, there are a number of general points that can be made.

Of those owners that replied, most demonstrated a keen awareness of the major issues and strong concerns about the river's management. By and large, the opinions and suggestions expressed did not come as a surprise. In most cases they served to confirm pre-conceived ideas about those issues owners regard as important and what they think should be done to improve management. If anything, there did not appear to be such a widespread strength of feeling about some issues as had been expected. Certainly, there was little evidence to support a belief that most of fishery owners are 'anti-navigation'. Indeed, of those that did express an opinion about navigation, the majority accepted it as a legitimate use of the river and maintained that ways needed to be found to enable the river to be shared.

A majority of owners stated that they do experience problems which affect the quality of their fishing, or at least their enjoyment of the sport. Of these, navigation was cited as one of the main causes. However, there was no clear consensus as to the specific nature of the problem. The difficulties experienced appear to vary considerably, with no clear pattern emerging. Not surprisingly, given their levels of participation, many of these problems centred around canoeing and rafting, although again the causes were many and varied.

Not only do there appear to be a many problems associated with navigation, a great many suggestions were put forward and with the aim of resolving them. Again, no clear consensus emerged. Few owners suggested practical ways in which their ideas could be implemented. There was a widespread feeling that navigation should be subject to tighter control. For instance, there was a strong body of opinion in favour of introducing a licensing scheme for all craft and for requiring navigation users to pay to use the river. There was also some support for imposing tighter restrictions on certain navigation activities which give rise to specific problems.

Significantly, most owners felt that they had no role to play in resolving any conflicts between navigation and angling. There was strong support for the N.R.A. or other responsible bodies to introduce outside controls or regulations, but few suggestions as to how conflicts might be resolved by consensus. An exception to the use of statutory controls, which received some support, was expanding the role of education to raise awareness about the river and other activities. There was also support for the introduction of a code of conduct to improve co-operation between users and make them more aware of each others needs.

Although few owners gave any indication of the frequency or scale of conflicts, it does appear that problems, where they do occur, are caused by a minority of individuals. A number of owners stated that over the years they had noticed an improvement in the behaviour of canoeists and in the consideration shown to anglers. Several owners praised canoeists and rafters in general for their good conduct and believed that there was a greater level of awareness; especially among the leaders of organised groups, who they felt had improved considerably over the years.





EXISTING INFORMATION SOURCES - ENVIRONMENT

INTRODUCTION

The following reports and publications are the most directly relevant sources of information about nature conservation and landscape interests in the Wye Valley. The list is by no means exhaustive. A great deal of additional information is available, much of which has not been published. A lot of information is held by English Nature and the Countryside Council for Wales, by non-statutory groups and by local naturalists and other interested individuals.

GENERAL

Nature Conservancy Council River_Wye Corridor Survey 1988 (Unpublished)

This major survey was undertaken between August and September, 1988 and covers the stretch of the river between a point just west of Hay-on-Wye and its mouth. The work was carried out by a two person survey team under contract to the NCC.

The river we divided into ½ km stretches. The following information was recorded:-

- o The physical feature of the channel including its dimensions, substrata and bank type.
- o Adjacent land use.
- o Bankside vegetation.
- o Channel vegetation (where obviously identifiable from the banks).
- o Other points of interest.

Both banks of the river were surveyed. The information collected is contained on a series of annotated maps, together with a written description and a photographic record.

Although the methodology used was appropriate for collecting the level of information required of this type of corridor survey, it does have limitations:-

- o The survey was carried out from one bank only.
- o Generally, the survey stopped at the water's edge and only considered bankside vegetation.
- o It did not look in detail at fauna.
- o The level of species identification in the vegetation survey was very general and may have overlooked some of the more unusual species, lower plants and early flowering species.

Despite these limitations, this survey does provide the most comprehensive record of vegetation and river structure available for the Wye, and is a most useful reference, especially when considering proposals for development adjacent to the river.

Nature Conservancy Council (1987) <u>Gazetteer of Sites of Nature Conservation</u> <u>Interest in the Wye Valley AONB.</u>

This report provides the most comprehensive assessment of non SSSI sites of nature conservation interest within the AONB. It is based on information held by English Nature and the Countryside Council for Wales, and that provided by the county nature trusts in Herefordshire, Gloucestershire and Gwent, all whom have undertaken some key site surveys. Information is held on a series of maps and written details are available for each site.

Herefordshire Nature Trust Ltd/Worcestershire Nature Conservation Trust Ltd Special Wildlife Sites in the County of Hereford and Worcester (1990)

This report contains details of key sites in Hereford and Worcester which, though not SSSIs, are none the less important locally for nature conservation. The information contained in the report is based on survey work carried out by the trusts and is intended to be kept up to date. It contains details of a number of sites adjacent or close to the river. It is particularly useful for that part of Herefordshire outside the AONB where information is otherwise scarce.

NCC Nature Conservation in the Wye Valley AONB 1977

This report to the Wye Valley ANOB Joint Advisory Committee reviews the prospects for nature conservation within the AONB. It followed on from a previous report ("Nature Conservation in the Wye Valley AONB" 1971, Nature Conservancy) and a series of supplementary reports giving details of local interest and sites in each of the three counties - Herefordshire, Gloucestershire and (at the time) Monmouthshire.

The report contains an assessment of natural history interests within the AONB and discusses how the conservation of these interests may be influenced by policies and practices in forestry, river management and land use.

The Appendix to the report lists 77 sites of natural history interest, with a general description, points of interest and an assessment of their importance. It also contains a map showing the extent and distribution of important sites and the main physiographical zones.

Gloucestershire Trust for Nature Conservation Rivers Survey 1978

This report includes a section on the Gloucestershire stretch of the Wye. The river is divided into 1 km lengths, and is discussed under the following headings:-

- o Physical features (geology, topography, profile, substrata, flow and turbidity).
- o Human influence (land use, artefacts, outflows and recreation).
- Vegetation, including aquatic, marsh and emergent vegetation and adjacent habitats.
- o Fauna (fish, birds and mammals).
- o Areas meriting conservation.

This survey provides a useful summary of the main interests on this section of the river although it is fairly superficial in its approach. It has also to some extent been superseded by the more recent NCC survey.

NCC River Wye Survey of Herefordshire 1979

This survey, which is based on data on riparian habitats held by the NCC, lists those sites along the river which were selected as being most important for their natural history interest, together with a description of their important features. It concentrates on riparian land and adjacent land uses. Again this information is dated and has been superseded by more recent reports.

R. W. Edwards and M. P. Brooker The Ecology of the Wve 1982

This book summarises a substantial body of scientific information about the Wye. In doing so, it draws together the results of past investigations into

various aspects of the River's ecology. The book is divided into a number of chapters covering physiography, water quality, plants, macro-invertebrates, fish, birds and mammals. It also considers the possible effects of future changes in land use and water resource management. The book's importance lies in the fact that at the time of publication, it was the most complete account of the ecology of the Wye. It also contains an extensive bibliography of past publications and scientific papers.

BIRDS

RSPB Survey of the Birds of the River Wye (1977) Report prepared for the Nature Conservancy Council January 1978

This report is based upon a survey undertaken in the spring and summer of 1977 between Plynlimon and Redbrook - most of the river. The main objectives of the survey were:-

- o To determine the diversity, numbers and distribution of birds using the river and its banks, and to assess the breeding population of these species.
- o To relate the breeding density of birds to the physical and vegetation characteristics of the river and its banks.

The river was surveyed a total of 6 times. The species of bird recorded fell into 4 categories:-

- 1. Species closely associated with the river.
- 2. Species which used the river but did not nest on it or its banks.
- Waders which breed on land adjacent to the river.
- 4. Species associated mainly with the scrub and wasteland along the river bank.

In addition, the physical and vegetation characteristics of the river and its banks were recorded, i.e., aspects of river flow, river structure, river vegetation, bank vegetation, land use and man-made artefacts. The river was divided into several sections, reflecting its different physical characteristics.

A total of 129 species were recorded, of which 71 were breeding on the river or its banks. A further 6 were breeding on nearby waters and another 18 were probably breeding nearby. The remaining 34 were recorded only as visitors. From these a select list of 58 species were chosen for detailed counts. The results of the census are illustrated on a series of maps showing the distribution of each species, together with an assessment of the number of breeding territories. The maps are accompanied by a written description for each species.

This is the only comprehensive survey of bird populations to be undertaken on the Wye. It is, however, fifteen years out of date and cannot be regarded as a definitive record of present day bird populations. Its usefulness is as a base upon which future surveys can build.

WOODLAND

The Wye Valley is internationally important for its woodland and the amount of information held about them is extensive. Those within the AONB, which contains most of the major blocks, are particularly well documented. Many have been designated as SSSIs and are managed, at least in part, for conservation and amenity. Some are owned by the Forestry Commission.

Ancient Woodland Inventories

English Nature and The Countryside Council for Wales are in the process of compiling inventories of ancient woodland for each county. These are in varying stages of completion and, once complete, will form a valuable record of these important habitats and landscape features. Inventories are available for Herefordshire, Gloucestershire and Gwent. There is no comparable inventory for Powys.

I. C. Bolt Wve Valley Woodlands Project Report (1980).

This important report is the culmination of a two year project sponsored by the Nature Conservancy Council. It covers all woodlands within the AONB and contains a great deal of information about each area of woodland. This is held on a series of maps, record cards and species lists.

LANDSCAPE

Company of Designers Ltd <u>The Wve Valley Study (1991)</u> (Report Commissioned by the Wye Valley AONB Joint Advisory Committee)

This report is an appraisal of the landscape of the entire Wye Valley AONB. It looks at the land use, topographic, ecological and historical components of the valley and identifies those landscape features which contribute most to the special qualities of the area. It also identifies a number of major landscape issues affecting the AONB. The report recognises in particular the special beauty of the Wye Gorge landscape with the river as it focus, and the various activities centred on the river. Some of the potentially damaging consequences of recreation and tourism use of the river are discussed, including the development and control of canoe access points and the impact of fishery improvements.

Hereford and Worcester County Council - County Landscape Appraisal 1990

The intention of this appraisal was to collect information about the visual experience, historical importance and ecological value of the landscape within Hereford and Worcester, whilst taking into account activities such as agriculture, recreation and tourism, and their relationship with the landscape. A wide range of information was collected including statutorily protected areas, topography, slopes, woodland, habitat types, sites of nature conservation interest and historic landscapes. This is held on a series of Ordnance Survey map overlays.

An report sets out the findings of the appraisal and the issues arising from it. This report incorporates the advice and comments from a number of statutory and voluntary organisations.

The purpose of the report is to assist with:-

- o Reviewing the landscape policies of the county structure plan and providing a planning framework for local planning authorities.
- o Identifying opportunities for landscape management.
- o Identifying priorities and programmes for those agencies involved in countryside management.

Although the report is very general in its approach and does not deal specifically with the River Wye, it does form a useful data base of information about landscape interests in the Herefordshire section of the Valley.

PREVIOUS STUDIES OF RECREATION ON THE WYE

D. Crease and E. C. Penning-Rowsell <u>Pressure and Conflict: Managing Recreation</u>
and Sharing Water Space on the River Wye Middlesex Polytechnic 1985

This report was the culmination of a research study into the recreational use of the Wye between Glasbury and Chepstow, commissioned by the Welsh Water Authority. It considers the use made of the river by the various recreational activities and examines the perceptions and attitudes of groups such as riparian and fishery owners, recreational users and conservationists. The main aim of the study was to consider the conflicts between competing uses and to recommend practical means of resolving them.

The research methodology used involved using two sets of questionnaire surveys; one aimed at river users (e.g., canoeists, fishermen, visitors/tourists) and one aimed at non-users (e.g., fishery owners, bailiffs, canoeists and other navigation interests, nature conservation bodies and statutory agencies). A limited postal survey of canoe clubs and associations was also carried out.

The study provided a lot of information about the pattern of recreational use on the Wye and the nature and extent of any conflicts, both between different users and between users and non-users. However, whilst the report does provide some good examination, there are serious limitations arising from the research method adopted. The reliance on questionnaires alone is inherently subjective. This particularly affects the estimates of the level and distribution of use. No 'on the ground' monitoring was carried out.

Despite these drawbacks, the report does contain a valuable body of comments and opinions drawn from a wide variety of individuals, and there is no reason to challenge the main conclusions and recommendations of the report.

J. Foster Angling and Canoeing on the River Wve UWIST 1988

This report, commissioned by the Welsh Water Authority, sought to quantify the total number of canoeists and anglers using the Wye, and to look at the patterns of activity of the two groups. Counts of anglers and canoeists were carried out over 66 days between June 1987 and February 1988. These took place either from a canoe or from the bank. The number and location of canoeists and anglers observed was recorded and where possible, the origin of canoeists was noted.

A great deal of data was collected and from this an estimate of the relative levels of use and the potential for conflict was calculated. However, caution should be expressed about the reliability of these findings. The survey methods used are likely to result in inaccuracies - the sites chosen for survey (i.e., bridges) were arbitrary and unsystematic, and the counts only took place for short period at each point. The number of staff employed to carry out the surveys was very limited.

Comment

These two reports (Crease and Penning-Rowsell and Foster) together form the only previous authoritative estimates of recreational use of the Wye. Both surveys found the distribution and pattern of use by canoeists and anglers to be broadly similar. Game fishing and canoeing were found to be common along most of the river, with particularly high concentrations of canoeists at Glasbury and Symonds Yat. However, there are significant differences between the two reports when it comes to estimating the relative numbers within each

group. For instance, Foster puts the number of game angler day visits at 16910 per year compared to Crease and Penning-Rowsell's 5-7000, whereas Crease and Penning-Rowsell's estimate of 30-35000 canoeists contrasts with Foster's estimate of 13472.

Much of this discrepancy can probably be attributed to the methodology used. Foster's report is possibly more reliable in that it was at least based upon direct observation, whereas Crease and Penning-Rowsell based their estimates solely on the opinions and observations of third parties.

Welsh Water Authority/Wye Valley AONB Joint Advisory Committee Report of the proceedings of the conference held on 4th June, 1989 entitled 'The Wye - Consensus or Chaos'

This is a collection of papers, presented to a specially convened conference by representatives from some of the main statutory agencies with responsibility for the Wye and by the various sporting governing bodies. Together, they are a useful summary of the important issues affecting the Wye at the time. They rehearse many of the concerns expressed by the various river users and highlight some of the potential ways forward. Two of its conclusions, the need for an overall management plan and the appointment of a project officer, led to the inception of the River Wye Project.

Sports Council for Wales/Welsh Water Authority River Canoeing in Wales 1980

This report examines the opportunities for canoeing in Wales and the problems of access faced by canoeists. It also sets out the physical requirements for different branches of the sport. The most useful aspect of the report is its wide ranging analysis of the access question and the ways in which access can be improved. It highlights a number of alternative viewpoints on this issue, including those of other river users and owners. It concentrates on the conflict between canoeing and angling in particular, and puts forward several recommendations aimed at reducing conflict. A number of different access agreements are examined in detail and, of direct relevance to the Wye, the issues of canoe registration and payment are discussed.

NRA BYELAW MAKING POWERS WATER RESOURCES ACT 1991

SCHEDULE 25

BYELAW-MAKING POWERS OF THE AUTHORITY

Byelaws for regulating use of inland waters

- 1.—(1) Subject to the following provisions of this paragraph but without prejudice to the powers conferred by the following provisions of this Schedule, where it appears to the Authority to be necessary or expedient to do so for the purposes of any of the functions specified in paragraphs (a), (c) and (d) of section 2(1) of this Act. the Authority may make byelaws—
 - (a) prohibiting such inland waters as may be specified in the byelaws from being used for boating (whether with mechanically propelled boats or otherwise), swimming or other recreational purposes; or
 - (b) regulating the way in which any inland waters so specified may be used for any of those purposes.
 - (2) Byelaws made by the Authority under this paragraph shall not apply to-
 - (a) any tidal waters or any discrete waters;
 - (b) any inland waters in relation to which functions are exercisable by a navigation authority, harbour authority or conservancy authority other than the Authority; or
 - (c) any reservoir belonging to, and operated by, a water undertaker.
- (3) Byelaws made in respect of any inland waters by virtue of this paragraph may—
 - (a) include provision prohibiting the use of the inland waters by boats which are not for the time being registered with the Authority in such manner as the byelaws may provide; and
 - (b) authorise the Authority to make reasonable charges in respect of the registration of boats in pursuance of the byelaws.

Byelaws for regulating the use of navigable waters etc.

- 2.—(1) The Authority shall have power to make such byclaws as are mentioned in sub-paragraph (3) below with respect to any inland waters in relation to which—
 - (a) there is a public right of navigation; and
- (b) the condition specified in sub-paragraph (2) below is satisfied, and with respect to any land associated with such waters.
- (2) For the purposes of this paragraph the condition mentioned in subparagraph (1) above is satisfied in relation to any waters if navigation in those waters—
 - (a) is not for the time being subject to the control of any navigation authority, harbour authority or conservancy authority; or
 - (b) is subject to the control of such a navigation authority, harbour authority or conservancy authority as is prescribed for the purposes of this paragraph by reason of its appearing to the Secretary of State to be unable for the time being to carry out its functions.
- (3) The byelaws referred to in sub-paragraph (1) above in relation to any inland waters or to any land associated with any such waters are byelaws for any of the following purposes, that is to say—
 - (a) the preservation of order in or on any such waters or land;
 - (b) the prevention of damage to anything in or on any such waters or land or to any such land;

- (c) securing that persons resorting to any such waters or land so behave as to avoid undue interference with the enjoyment of the waters or land by others.
- (4) Without prejudice to the generality of any of the paragraphs of sub-paragraph (3) above or to the power conferred on the Authority by virtue of paragraph 4 below, the byelaws mentioned in that sub-paragraph include byelaws—
 - (a) regulating sailing, boating, bathing and fishing and other forms of recreation;
 - (b) prohibiting the use of the inland waters in question by boats which are not for the time being registered, in such manner as may be required by the byelaws, with the Authority;
 - (c) requiring the provision of such sanitary appliances as may be necessary for the purpose of preventing pollution; and
 - (d) authorising the making of reasonable charges in respect of the registration of boats for the purposes of the byelaws.
- (5) In this paragraph "boat" includes a vessel of any description, and "boating" shall be construed accordingly.

THE LEGAL STATUS OF NAVIGATION ON THE RIVER WYE

Report by NRA Regional Solicitor - April 1992

The aim of this report is to outline the legal position as regards navigation rights on the River Wye and to answer the question:-

Is there a public right of navigation on the River Wye?

General

The public may acquire rights of navigation in one or more of the following ways:-

- (a) where Statute confers such rights on the public, or
- (b)(i) by express (or implied) grant by the riparian owners,
- (b)(ii) on proof of immemorial user.

Over tidal waters however, there is a presumption that the public has a right to navigate.

Already therefore it becomes clear that in considering the public's right to navigate the River Wye a distinction must be drawn between the tidal and the non-tidal Wye.

The Tidal Wye

It is generally accepted that the tidal limit of the Wye is found at Bigsweir, below Monmouth. It can therefore be said with certainty that upon this stretch of the Wye, that is from the mouth of the Wye to Bigsweir, that a public right of navigation exists. To my knowledge this right has not been subject to rebuttal it remains physically navigable and as such the public have navigated this stretch freely without dispute for many years.

It is on the River above this point, the non-tidal Wye where uncertainty arises.

The Non-Tidal Wve

The presumption on tidal rivers that a public right of navigation exists is based on the fact that it is the Crown that owns the bed of a river up to the limits of the tide. Above the flow of the tide land beneath a river is privately owned so that while the public can acquire navigational rights over such waters they cannot have them as of right. As outlined above the public can acquire such rights in one of three ways: by statute; by express grant or on proof of immemorial user.

a) The Statutory Position

Four Acts of Parliament have been identified as applying to the River Wye but only three of these have been considered relevant to this report namely:-

- 1. 14 Charles II Chap 14, Royal Assent 19 May 1662
- 2. 7 & 8 William III Chap 14, Royal Assent 7 March 1695
- 3. George III Chap 78, Royal Assent 20 May 1809

To the best of my knowledge none of the above have been subject to repeal and therefore the laws created by them remain in force to date.

1. The first of these three, 14 Charles II is entitled:-

"An Act for the making navigable the Rivers Wye & Lugg and the Rivers and Brookes running into the same in the County of Hereford, Gloucester and Monmouth."

Brief Summary:-

This Act gave authority to the Sandys (Sir William, Windsor & Henry) as trustees, to "make navigable the Rivers Wye and Lugg... in the County of Hereford and other adjacent Countyes" with the view to improving trade on the River Wye by removing all "impediments to navigation" and setting up a system of locks and weirs along the river.

It is the Act which follows this one, ie. that of 7 & 8 William III 1695 (which is referred to, for the purposes of this report, as the 'main Act') on which most of my attention has been centred for it is this Act which expressly creates public rights of navigation on the River Wye. Hence, consideration is now given to this Act but references will also be made to the 1662 Act.

2. 7 & 8 William III Chap 14 - 1695

This Act was entitled:-

"An Act for making navigable the Rivers of the Wye & Lugg in the County of Hereford."

and is referred to as the 'main' Act.

This Act was introduced as a continuance of the former Act of 1662, the aim being to increase trade upon the said Rivers Wye and Lugg by making them 'free and common' for all.

Brief Summary

Under the previous Act, inter alia, powers, rights and privileges had been granted to the Sandys to undertake works laid out in the Statute with the aim of improving navigation on the said rivers. The Sandys received monies in order to undertake this work.

However, it is said that the Sandys "did nothing towards the making of the said River of Lugg navigable, and what they did towards the said work upon the said River of Wye was performed so slightly, that most of the locks and passages by them made, did in a very few years fall utterly to decay and ruin."

The purpose of the "main" Act then was to create a number of trustees to whom the task of completing these works and making the rivers navigable was given. Thus all powers, vested in the Sandys and all rights and privileges enjoyed by them (plus additional powers) were transferred to the trustees named in the main Act to hold on trust "for the good and benefit of the people of Hereford".

There is no doubt that this Act expressly creates a public right of navigation over the Rivers Wye and Lugg and their tributaries but some doubt has been expressed as to whether these rights extend along the whole length of the Rivers Wye & Lugg or are limited to within the County of Hereford.

Arguments for and against

There is evidence to suggest that the rights expressly granted by the main Act of the public to navigate the said River extend only to the length of the river which lies within the County of Hereford.

The main argument put forward by proposers of this interpretation stems from the reference to Hereford in the long title of that Act:-

"An Act for making navigable the rivers of Wye and Lugg in the County of Hereford".

This would appear at first glance to place a geographical limitation on these rights. However, although the long title of the 'main' Act makes reference to the County of Hereford the enacting clause itself, which expressly creates the public right of navigation, makes no such limitation. It states as follows:-

"the said Rivers of Wye and Lugg be, and from henceforth be accounted, deemed and taken to be free and common rivers and streams, to and for all his majesties subjects, freely to make use of...."

The words of the enacting clause are clear and unambiguous and although the title of an Act may be looked at for the purpose of interpreting the statute as a whole it may not for the purpose of contradicting the clear and unambiguous language of particular provisions.

Furthermore, if we refer back to the Act of 1662 we find that whilst the long title of that Act refers specifically to the Countyes of Monmouth, Gloucester and Hereford further reference is made in the provisions to "other adjacent countyes" and it is this reference which has been interpreted by some as constituting an extension of the improvement of navigation on the upper Wye ie. above Hay, and thus that the public rights granted under the main Act, with a view to improving navigation, must also apply to the 'Upper Wye' (see attached diagram for 'Upper Wye').

In addition the 'main Act' refers to monies raised under the 1662 Act by way of a trust fund, for the completion of the works on the river and it also stipulated that this trust was to be for:

"the good and benefit of the inhabitants of the said County of Hereford."

This reference could be regarded as further evidence that the public right of navigation was intended to be created solely within the County of Hereford since the monies raised were raised solely within that County for the "good and benefit" of those that lived there. However, it is also possible to argue in the alternative. When we consider that the purpose of these three Acts was to make the River Wye navigable thus improving trade on the said river then we can say that it would be for the good and benefit of the people of Hereford, in terms of trade, for that public right of navigation to extend along the full length of the river. After all trade would not have been confined within the County boundary of Hereford but would have extended along the full length of the river.

3. George III, 1809 - The title of this Act was:-

"An Act for amending several Acts for making navigable the Rivers Wye & Lugg, in the County of Hereford and for making a Horse Towing path on certain points of the banks of the said River Wye."

This Act provides for the creation of a company whose purpose was to-build_a_towing path along the banks of the River Wye. The aim was to aid free navigation of vessels upon the River Wye and thus render the main Act more effectual.

Whilst it is recognised that the main title of this Act makes reference again to the County of Hereford it is suggested that since this Act was introduced to make "the main Act" more effectual it cannot intend to confine any public right of navigation conferred to the County of Hereford, if we take the view that this was not the purpose of the main Act.

It is my opinion that on the basis of the evidence studied and which is presented above that when the Act of 1695 was drafted it was not the draftsman's intention to limit the public right of navigation, which it expressly creates, to the County of Hereford but that the right should extend along the whole length of the non-tidal Wye.

However, I must stress that the position is far from certain and I suggest that the only way that a definite answer could be given would be by way of a Court ruling.

b) THE COMMON LAW POSITION

Where a statute does not expressly grant a public right of navigation attention must be turned towards the Common Law to infer that such a right exists.

As has been stated in the previous section a public right of navigation certainly exists on the River Wye within the County of Hereford but it remains uncertain as to whether these rights extend to the Upper Wye, above Hay-on-Wye and into Wales. In the absence of a definite ruling I have turned to the Common Law.

As was noted at the beginning of this report public rights of navigation over a watercourse may be acquired in one of three ways, the second and third are now considered:-

i) By express (or implied) grant by the riparian owners

Public rights of navigation can arise through express or implied dedication of the right to navigate by all riparian owners.

It is suggested that to rely on this method of acquiring a public right of navigation is doubtful and unlikely to succeed and should therefore be discarded from consideration.

ii) On proof of immemorial user

The acquisition of a right arising from long user must be founded on custom, prescription or the doctrine of lost grant.

However, the public cannot acquire rights by custom as customary rights are confined to specific classes of people rather than the public at large. Nor can the public acquire rights by prescription without evidence of express or implied dedication (refer to the case of: AG -v- Esher Lindleum Co Ltd [1901] 2 Ch. 647) which, as is suggested above, in the light of the recent decision in the Derwent Case cannot be considered an option in these circumstances ie. when considering public rights of navigation. This would appear to leave only the option of the doctrine of lost grant, a doctrine adopted by the Courts, as a result of the difficulties in proving continuous user since time immemorial

(1189), and under which user as of right will be presumed where there is proof of continuous user for a period of 20 years or more. However this doctrine has been suggested as inappropriate by John Bates, a Barrister in his work entitled "Water and Land Drainage Law" 1990, with supplements to date, since to base the right on this doctrine would be to hold that the public was granting itself the right as it arises from the fact that the river is owned by the public.

So after considering all the possibilities, as outlined above, and especially the implications of the decision in the case of: Wills Trustees -v- Cairngorn Canoeing & Sailing School ([1976] S.C.30, S.L.T. 162) it has been suggested that the basis of a public right of navigation in a non-tidal river should be treated as a legal class of its own. I refer to Lord Fraser's speech in the Wills Trustee Case:-

"I have reached the opinion that a public right of navigation in a non-tidal river depends not only upon the theoretical navigability of the river but also on the proof of its actual use for that purpose, although I think the word 'prescriptive' in this context is apt to mislead by suggesting that navigation is a servitude right, which it is not, or at least that it is closely analogous to a right of way of land."

If we then apply this to the present situation, the criteria to be applied to the non-tidal River Wye, as regards whether the public have a right to navigate exists, will be based on the physical characteristics of the river and whether it is suitable for use by the public. It will also rely on evidence of actual public user since time immemorial. For evidence of public user it will be necessary to show "continuous user as of right" by the public as far as living testimony can go ie. 60-70 years.

A right will be exercised "as of right" if it is exercised in the following way:-

Nec vi - without force Nec clam - without secrecy nec precario - without permission.

To conclude the Common Law position as regards public navigation rights on the River Wye will depend on the following:-

- 1. Whether the River Wye is by its physical nature navigable by the public. The increasing use by the public of the Wye for recreational purposes, especially canoeing, may assist this argument.
- 2. That evidence can be deduced to prove continuous user as of right by the public on the River Wye since time immemorial. This evidence must show in the manner set out by Viscount Maugham, in the case of, Wolstanton Ltd -v-Newcastle Borough Council [1940] 3All ER 101, continuous user as of right, going as far back as living testimony can go, which would be about 60 to 70 years. The collection of such evidence would no doubt be assisted by the continued growth in recreational activities over recent years.

It is my opinion, based on the evidence presently available to me, that any claim that a public right of navigation exists over the whole of the River Wye based on the Common Law principles outlined above would not be difficult to sustain provided the necessary evidence could be produced.

CONCLUSION

(Please refer to the attached diagram headed "An Outline of the Legal Status of Navigation on the River Wye".)

There is no doubt that a public right of navigation exists over the tidal Wye to the point of Bigsweir which marks the tidal limit of the Wye.


Furthermore, there is no doubt that the Statute of 1695 (7 & 8 William III) expressly grants a public right of navigation over the non tidal Wye which lies within the County of Hereford, as shown on the diagram. There is however, a considerable amount of conflicting opinion as to whether this right of navigation extends along the length of the River Wye.

It is my opinion, based on the evidence available, that it was the intention of the draftsman when they expressly granted a public right of navigation by the 1695 Act that this right was to extend to the whole length of the river and not be limited to that part of the Wye which lies within the County of Hereford. However, I can give no enforceable ruling on the matter, as this would require a court ruling. However, in the absence of such a Court ruling the common law position has been considered as regards the Upper Wye. The conclusion reached is that at common law a public right of navigation will be established if evidence can be deduced to prove:

- 1. That the River is physically capable of navigation.
- 2. That there has been a continuous user as of right by the public since living memory ie. over the last 60-70 years.

The increasing use of the Wye in recent years for recreational pursuits such as canoeing may be of some assistance in this regard.

Having considered both the Statutory and Common Law positions there appears to be an arguable case to support the view that a public right of navigation extends along the length of the River Wye.



WYE CODE OF CONDUCT

This advice is intended to help you to enjoy the river, whilst not spoiling the enjoyment of others or damaging the environment: Detailed guidance is given for each activity which, if followed, should ensure that problems are avoided. It is essential that all river users make an effort to follow these guidelines.

Learn about other activities by reading the whole of this section. Try to understand their needs and help to encourage a spirit of goodwill and cooperation by showing consideration for others.

GENERAL GUIDANCE TO ALL USERS

- Look after the environment and avoid damaging the banks and bankside vegetation. Do not pick, uproot or trample wild plants.
- Take special care not to disturb beds of water-weed and gravel beds.
- Do not disturb birds and other wildlife you find along the river. Keep clear of nesting birds and areas important for breeding fish.
- Never throw rubbish into the river or leave it on the banks. Take it home or place it in a bin.
- Please be as quiet as possible. Do not spoil the enjoyment of others.
- Show understanding to those engaged in organised competition. Have regard to any instructions given by officials.
- Have special regard for the problems of those new to a sport, as you would for learner drivers on the road.

and cannot use such shallow water as canoes.

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- Keep clear of rowing craft and rafts, particularly when racing or serious coaching is taking place. Remember that it is sometimes difficult for others to see Canoes.
- Salmon lay their eggs between October and March. During this period trampling and launching canoes on gravels used by salmon may damage unhatched eggs and young fry. This is of particular concern upstream of Glasbury and when the water level is low. Please do not canoe if the risk of disturbance is high.
- It is an offence to wilfully disturb breeding fish or spawning beds. Please leave the water if requested to do so by an NRA bailiff. Such a request will only be made where there is a real risk of disturbance.

RAFTING If paddling upstream, do not sit on fast flowing water and thereby remain stationary if there are anglers nearby.

Make sure that any pieces of broken raft are cleared away. Do not leave debris in the river.



- · Avoid pollution. If using old barrels, make sure that they are clean and empty beforehand.
- . If following a raft race from the bank. take care not to cause a nuisance. Do not trespass on private land. Keep to public footpaths, close farm gates and do not damage crops.

ROWING Look out for others on the water and be ready to change speed and direction if


- Hail to draw a person's attention to a situation which might result in inconvenience, damage or collision. Treat a hail as a friendly warning and not as an
- Display warning notices at each end of a stretch of river being used for competitions.

GUIDANCE FOR SPECIFIC ACTIVITIES

Governing bodies of most water sports produce rules for safety and other matters. These should be read and understood before taking part in any activity. See the back of this handbook for addresses of governing bodies.

ANGUNG Take your rubbish home, especially discarded tackle. Hooks and nylon line are dangerous to birds and animals. If you snag a line in bushes, trees or weed. do your best to clear it and the hook completely.

Remember that when you are concealed by bushes, it is difficult for other river users to see you or your tackle in time to take avoiding action. Hail if you think you have unbeen seen.



Bear in mind that canoes and other craft do not always disturb fish and if they are properly handled and pass by quietly and quickly they may do little or no harm to fishing on deep, wide water.

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necessary to avoid collision. Remember that it may be difficult for others to see fast moving rowing craft which lie low in the water.

MOTORISED CRAFT

Keep a sharp lookout for other river users and be ready to change speed or direction to avoid a collision. When approaching other users, slow down and give a clear indication of your intentions.

- Respect the needs of anglers whose recreation can be spoilt by thoughtless behaviour. Keep a good distance from them and avoid their lines. Create as little disturbance as possible.

 Speeding is dangerous. Accidents are
- more likely to occur at high speeds so where possible keep to a walking pace, especially when there are other people on
- · Keep a check on your wash. All moving craft create wash and excessive can:-
 - Harm wildlife.
- Be dangerous to swimmers and those in canoes and other small craft.
- Damage banks and bankside vegetation.
- Interfere with fishing.
- Avoid shallow water as you may disturb the bed of the river and plants which are important to fish and other river life.
- Help keep the river clean. Do not

WATER-SKIING For environmental and safety reasons the Wye is generally not suitable for water-

- Acknowledge considerate behaviour by other river users.
- Take care when casting to avoid hitting or frightening other river users. Look in front and behind to check the area is clear. Remember, hooks, lines and weights can be dangerous.
- Respect the rights of navigation and do not cast a fly or bait immediately in front of an approaching craft.
- Take care not to block riverside footpaths with your tackle.

GUIDANCE FOR ALL BOAT USERS

This advice applies to all boat users and should be read alongside the sectionon individual activities.

- Look out for anglers. Keep a good distance from them and avoid their lines Pass by quickly and quietly, creating a-little disturbance as possible and do not loiter in fishing pools.
- Keep well clear of wading anglers or anglers in boats and leave enough roon in front and behind them for their cast.
- Comply with any signals anglers make to indicate whether they wish you to pass by or wait a moment. Hail if you think your approach has not been noticed.
- Except in an emergency, launch, land or come ashare from boats only at recognised landing places. Do not trespass on private banks.
- Park vehicles and trailers responsibly so that they do not cause a nuisance. Do not enter or park on private land without permission.

CANDEING Groups of young or inexperienced canonists should be accompanied by a suitably experienced, responsible person; preferably a qualified canoinstructor.

. Do not get in the way of other craft by suddenly changing course. Remember that larger boats are less manocuvrable

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a consequence these uses are largely confined to the tidal stretches where the river is physically more suitable.

- Water-skiers should operate in a careful and responsible manner and keep a reasonable distance from other users so as not to endanger people or property. Keep a sharp lookout for other river
- users and be prepared to slow down or change direction to avoid a collision or disturbing them with your wash.
- All powerboats towing skiers should be operated by at least two competent people, allowing the driver to watch the river shead and the second person to watch the skier and relay any signals to the driver.

SWIMMING

Due to strong currents, the depth of water, underwater obstructions such as weed and tree roots and the danger from aharp stones and broken glass, you are advised not to swim in the River Wye. It ia particularly dangerous to jump or dive off bridges.

SUB AQUA

Check that you have permission from the landowner and fishery owner before you dive.

- Warn other river users that divers are below the surface by displaying the international code flag A or a notice visible to river traffic. Post a lookout to warn craft that they are approaching a diving area.
- Keep well away from anglers and others who are likely to be disturbed by divers.
- Do not dive in busy areas or close to bridges.

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
