GUIDE TO FRESHWATER FISHING in the Northern Area of Anglian Region











INTRODUCTION

This booklet is a guide to angling within the NRA Anglian Region Northern Area. This covers an area from the Humber down to and including the River Nene. Both stillwaters and rivers are covered. Section one covers the Lincoln catchment area, while Section two covers the Welland and Nene catchments. The list is by no means exhaustive and the Anglian Region of the National Rivers Authority would welcome any information on waters not listed. Whilst every effort has been made to ensure that details are correct at the time of going to press, accuracy cannot be guaranteed. It is therefore advisable to check membership details and day ticket availability with the relevant club or fishery owner before setting out.

ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS

The NRA is grateful to angling clubs and fishery owners for their help in compiling this guide and would appreciate any up-dates on waters or contact numbers.

Many of the waters listed have been visited by Mr. David Edgoose of the Lincoln Disabled Anglers Association. Those waters he thought most suitable for disabled anglers are denoted with the following symbol:

FISHING LICENCES

Anyone aged twelve or over who goes freshwater fishing in England and Wales must have a current NRA rod licence. Concessionary licences are currently available to juveniles (12-15 years) and to retired or disabled persons. Short-term licences are also available.

The National Rod Fishing Licence, introduced in January 1992, allows you to fish anywhere in England and Wales.

The licence covers all species, including salmon and sea trout. Local byelaws allow up to two rods to be used within the Anglian Region.

Licenses are available from most fishing tackle dealers or may be obtained, along with the booklet Fisheries Byelaws, by writing to:

Licences run from 1st April to 31st March. It must also be remembered that it is important to obtain the necessary permission from the owner of the fishing rights before fishing on privately owned waters or river banks and on fisheries controlled by angling clubs.

Anglers must observe fisheries byelaws and relevant acts at all times.

Some of the principle regulations affecting anglers are:

CLOSE SEASONS - ROD AND LINE

- Coarse fish: 15th March to 15th June inclusive. Except enclosed waters within the area of the former Lincolnshire River Authority where there is no close season for coarse fish, ie including most of the stillwaters covered by section 1.
- Brown and rainbow trout: 30th October to 31st March inclusive except rainbow trout in enclosed waters which are exempt.
- Salmon and migratory trout: 29th September to 28th/29th February inclusive.



ANGLERS MUST NOT

- Introduce any fish without permission from the National Rivers Authority.
- Remove more than two coarse fish from any water, or two trout from rivers in any one day, except for livebaiting where a maximum of ten coarse fish is permitted.
- Fish for eels during the close season except as permitted in byelaw.
- Fish for salmon and trout during the coarse fish close season with any lure or bait other than artificial fly.

GOOD ANGLING PRACTICE - THE DO'S AND DON'TS

DO

- Handle fish carefully with wet hands. Scales are easily removed and internal organs can be damaged by rough handling.
- Use barbless or semi-barbless hooks whenever possible.
- Return fish quickly and gently to the water.
- Use tackle of strength appropriate to the fish which you intend to catch. Using too fine a line can result in a fish left with a hook in its mouth.
- Follow the country code.
- Be considerate to other anglers and members of the public.

DO NOT

 Keep large fish, especially pike, barbel or carp in keepnets.

- Use lead weights. They are illegal and poisonous to wildlife.
- Use gaffs use a large landing net.
- Leave tackle set up and unattended. It is illegal.
- Leave rubbish and discarded tackle on the bank.

• Enjoy your fishing and leave the fish alive, healthy and fit for another day.

ADVISORY COMMITTEES

Three Area Fisheries Advisory Committees serve the Anglian Region of the NRA. They provide a direct link between anglers and the regional organisation.

The committees are consulted on a wide variety of policy and local fisheries matters and are represented on the main Regional Fisheries Advisory Committee.



SECTION 1 - LINCOLN CATCHMENT AREA MAJOR ANGLING CLUBS

RIVERS

The map on page 2 shows the major stretches of fishable river in the Lincoln catchment area. All are controlled by angling clubs and most can be fished on both day tickets and membership books.

BOSTON ANGLING ASSOCIATION

The following waters may be fished by holders of Boston A.A. membership books or day tickets. Both are available on the river bank or from local tackle shops. Membership secretary - J B Sawyer on 0205 35088.

Bargate and Sibsey Trader Drain - Both banks are available with access being easiest on the right bank. Fishing is very popular in the summer months, with roach, bream, pike and eels being the main species present. The NRA has constructed disabled fishing stands at Stonebridge and at other sites in the area to improve fishing access.

South Forty Foot - Both banks are available. Dominant species here are roach and bream.

River Bain Coningsby - Sections are available on both banks upstream and downstream of Bailey Bridge. A very popular winter spot with good numbers of chub, dace and roach being present.

Partney Brick Pits - No day tickets. See Stillwaters section.

River Witham - The parts of the River Witham held by Witham and District Joint Anglers Federation may also be fished by members.

GRANTHAM ANGLING ASSOCIATION

The waters below may be fished with a Grantham A.A. membership book. Membership books can be obtained from tackle shops or contact the Secretary, Mr. W Hutchins, 28 Cottesmore Close, Grantham, telephone 0476 75628 for further details. Further information on sites and access is given in the book.

Grantham Canal - Tow path side

from Earlsfield Lane Bridge, Grantham to Woolsthorpe Locks. Contains particularly good numbers of tench as well as common bream, roach and pike.

Upper Witham - Barkston area - Belton bypass bridge downstream to railway viaduct below sleeper bridge. This is for trout section members only, contact the Secretary for details.

Foston area - bank available both upstream and downstream of Foston Ford. Dominant species here are chub and dace.

Wesborough area - Downstream of footbridge. Dominant species are chub and dace.

Long Bennington area - Several sections between Long Bennington concrete bridge and Bennington mill. No fishing in mill pool. One section on left bank downstream of mill pool. Common bream, dace, chub and roach are all found here.



Marston - Two sections available.

Denton reservoir and Buckminster Brick pit can also be fished on a Grantham A.A. book, see Stillwaters section.

SCUNTHORPE & DISTRICT ANGLING ASSOCIATION

This angling club controls fishing along the entire river Ancholme (both banks). Year books which run from January to December are available from local tackle shops, day tickets are also available. The Ancholme supports an excellent coarse fishery containing most species, including good shoals of bream and roach. Contact Alan Gregory, Dan's Tackle Shop, telephone 0724 281877. The NRA have constructed disabled fishing stands on the Ancholme in Brigg (Leisure Centre and Cadney Road) and at Hibaldstow bridge.

BRITISH WATERWAYS BOARD

B.W.B. control the fishing along the entire Fossdyke Canal. Day tickets and season permits are available from the bailiff on the bank and from local tackle shops. Matches can be booked by contacting Joanne Connor on 0827 252000. Disabled pegs are available at Drinsey Nook. The canal supports good populations of most coarse species including particularly good shoals of bream.

WITHAM FOURTH DRAINAGE BOARD

The W.F.D.B. controls the fishing on the Hobhole Drain near Boston. Fishing is free, although matches are arranged by New Leake Angling Club, Duke of Wellington, Midville. Good numbers of roach, bream, perch, pike and eels are all present here.

HORNCASTLE ANGLING CLUB

Horncastle A.C. control fishing on the Horncastle canal from the swimming pool downstream for approximately 1 kilometre to the lock. Season permits only, available from Synco Sports, Horncastle. The canal supports a good mixed coarse fishery. Members may also fish Bells Yard Lake, Horncastle - see Stillwaters section. Contact Mr. K Dunnart, telephone 0507 527277.

LINCOLN AND DISTRICT ANGLING ASSOCIATION

The following waters may be fished on a Lincoln and District membership book, or day tickets. These can be obtained from local tackle shops or from the bank. Ms J Wolvers, telephone 0522 722781.

Upper Witham - Brayford Pool to River Brant Bassingham to BeckinghamNear Aubourn, access via Blackmoor Farm.

River Till - Odder (right hand bank) Thorpe-le-Fallows downstream of Thorpe Bridge Till Bridge - East bank either side of Bridge. Barlings Eau - Langworth.

Both the Witham and Till offer excellent coarse fishing with particularly good shoals of bream and roach.

Members may also fish Boultham Park Lake, Hartsholme Lake and Starmers Pit (see Stillwaters section).

WITHAM AND DISTRICT JOINT ANGLERS FEDERATION

The W. & D.J.A.F. consists of 7 clubs each of which pays a subscription on its membership books to fish waters held by the Federation. Membership of any of the clubs below allows you to fish Federation waters.

Lincoln & District Angling Association, Rotherham & District United Anglers Federation, Boston & District Angling Association, Grimsby & District Amalgamated Society of Anglers, Sheffield Amalgamated Anglers Society, Worksop & District Amalgamated Anglers Association, Newark & District Piscatorial Federation.

The following waters are held:

- River Witham numerous sections are held in the following areas: Lincoln to Bardney, Branston Island, Bardney Bridge to Boston Stixwould to downstream of Kirkstead Bridge
- Tattershall.

Other holdings on the Witham System:

- Sincil Drain/South Delph Sandhill Beck approximately 600m between Washingborough and Five Mile house
- North Delph approximately 7km of bank
- Timberland Delph between Martin Woods and the confluence with the Witham
- Billinghay Skirth 2 sections available Kyme Eau upstream of Chapel Hill Bridge.
- Horncastle Canal approximately 200m near the Railway Station.

River Steeping - Sections available through the parishes of Little Steeping, Firsby, Thorpe St Peter and Wainfleet all Saints:

Steeping Relief Channel - Thorpe Culvert Bridge to below the viaduct at Haven House. Lady Wath Beck approximately 1km available. Louth Navigation -Alvingham Fen to Tetney Lock.

Other sections of lesser angling importance are held on the following: East Halton Skitter, Waithe Beck, Tetney Drain, Wold Grift Drain, Old Fleet Drain and the River Freshney.

LINCOLN CATCHMENT AREA STILLWATERS

The following stillwaters are divided into 4 geographical sections, as shown right. The main access roads are shown on the more detailed map for each section. Further specific access details and prices can be obtained by phoning the contact numbers given or where clubs are concerned by consulting the relevant membership book. The numbers in brackets are 6 figure National Grid References and can be used in conjunction with Ordnance Survey Maps to locate the required water. Each NGR has a 2 letter prefix SE, SK, TF, or TA which relates to the letters found on OS maps.

1. ORCHARD POND South Humberside (SE 931223)

This ¹/₄ acre pond contains mixed coarse fish. Day tickets are available on site. No groundbait. For details contact Mr A Smith, 7 Silver Street, Winteringham, Humberside, telephone 0724 732498. Season: 1st May - 30th November.

2. TARGET LAKE -Barton upon Humber (TA 011231)

A 6 acre lake on the Humber bank containing roach, bream and carp. Fishing is by season ticket only. Contact Mr M Foster, 8 Aston Mall Drive, North Ferriby, telephone 0482 634154. Season: Open all year.

3. BARTON OUTDOOR PURSUITS CENTRE - Farlings Road, Barton-on-Humber (TA 019231)

This 30 acre lake is used for both coarse fishing and watersports. Tickets are free but restricted to Humberside registered youth groups only. Contact Rory Edwards at the Centre, telephone 0652 34933. Season: Open all year.

4. BARTON BROADS -

Maltkiln Road, Barton-on-Humber (TA 033227)

An 11 acre lake containing roach, bream, rudd, tench, carp and catfish. Day tickets are available from the owner. Contact Ainsworth & Fox, telephone 0652 632237.

5. PASTURE HOUSE FISHERY -Barton-on-Humber (TA 037232)

A complex of 3 lakes totalling 7¹/₂ acres. The largest lake (7 acres) contains roach, chub, rudd, tench, bream and carp. Day tickets are available from the owner. Night fishing is available by appointment only. Contact - see Hoe Hill Lake. Season: Open all year.

6. HOE HILL LAKE Barton-on-Humber (TA 041231)

This lake, sited on the banks of the River Humber, contains roach, rudd, carp, tench, bream and chub. Fishing on this 9 acre lake is by day ticket and night fishing is available by appointment. Anglers should contact JC/KD Smith, Pasture House Fishery, Barton-on-Humber, telephone 0652 635119. Season: Open all year.



7. PELICAN POND Barton-on-Humber (TA 039229)

This large 80 acre holds stocks of roach, tench, pike, eels and bream. Very large hauls are taken by anglers at favourable times of the year. Fishing is by season ticket only, available on the bank. Interested parties should contact North Lincs Sailing Club, Pasture Road, Barton-on-Humber, telephone 0652 33600. Season: Open all year.

8. EAST HALTON FISHING LAKES -Marsh Lane, East Halton (TA 154212)

A 15 acre lake containing mixed coarse fish. Fifty-five pegs are available on day tickets from the bank. Contact Winter Bros., telephone 0469 540238. Season: Open all year.

9. HOMESTEAD POND - Immingham (TA 179154)

This 30 peg lake contains a stock of roach, bream, tench, common and mirror carp. Both season tickets and night tickets are available. Further information from Immingham Town Council, Civic Centre, Pelham Road, Immingham. Telephone 0469 572763. Season: April - October.

10. KINGFISHER LODGE -

Cross Carr Lane, Hibaldstow (SE 992022)

A 3 acre coarse lake. Best fish of 1991 were carp 18lbs, chub 5lbs, tench 6lbs and bream 6lbs. Day tickets are available from the bank. Rules include no night fishing, no groundbait and no carp in nets. There is a caravan and camping site next to the lake. Contact Nigel, telephone 0652 652210. Season: Open all year.

11. FISH POND FARM - Usselby (TF 095952)

Two lakes containing mixed coarse fish species. One lake of 1¹/₂ acres, and another of just over 2 acres. Day tickets are available from the bank. Season tickets are also available. Contact the owner at 374, Warrington Road, Culceth, Cheshire. Telephone 0673 828219. Season: March - October.

12. TOFT NEWTON FISHERY -Toft Newton Reservoir, Market Rasen (TF 035875)


This 40 acre reservoir is stocked with brown trout and rainbow trout. Day tickets are available from the bank. Further details are available from Mr Foster, telephone 0673 878453 or 0673 878669. Season: March - December.

13. THE LOBBY FIELD SPORTS CENTRE - Orford Road, Binbrook, Lincoln (TF 200946)

This site includes a ³/₄ acre coarse fishery and a 1¹/₂ acre trout fishery. The coarse lake has produced carp to 13lbs in 1991. Day tickets are available from the bank. Groundbait is not allowed. The trout lake is fly only, no catch and release. Contact Mr Johnson telephone 0472 398782/398008. Season: Open all year.

14. THORPE LE VALE FISHERY - Louth (TF 202908)

This 5 acre trout fishery contains good stocks of both rainbow and brown trout. Fishing is by fly only with segregated lure fishing. Day tickets are available from Mr G Wildsmith, Thorpe Le Vale, Ludford, Louth, Lincolnshire. Season: March - December.



15. TETNEY LOCK ANGLING CLUB The Wharf, Tetney Lock, Grimsby (TA 340021)

This 3¹/₂ acre coarse lake contains rudd, roach, bream, tench, and carp. Fishing is for members only and there is a 1 to 2 year waiting list for membership. Groundbait is banned and carp must not be kept in nets. For further details contact Mr Norman, telephone 0472 388488. Season: Open all year.



16. NORTH THORESBY FISHERIES -Fen Lane, North Thoresby (TF 315988)

This large site consists of 3 lakes, 2 of which are available on day tickets. There is a 1 acre trout lake and a 4½ acre coarse lake. The coarse lake contains mostly carp (to 16lbs) and tench averaging 4 lbs. Contact J Casswell, telephone 0472 812518. Season: Open all year.

17. WARREN POND -

Warren Road, North Somercotes (TF 432960)

A small pond containing tench, roach, carp, rudd, perch and bream. Further details are available from the owner, Mr Lowis, telephone 0507 358350. Season: Open all year.

18. BRICKYARD FISHERY - Louth (TF 425948)

This 41/2 acre fishery has good stocks of mixed coarse fish. Fishing is by day ticket only. Interested parties should contact Mr I Cartwright, Brickyard Fishery, South Somercotes, Louth, telephone 0507 358331. Season: Open all year.

19. CHARLES STREET POND -Charles Street, Louth (TF 329878)

This 1 acre lake contains roach, crucian carp and tench and is leased by Louth C.A.W.C. Season tickets only, which can be obtained from local tackle shops. Season: Open all year.

20 . LINDEN WALK POND -Linden Walk, Louth (TF 333863)

Wellington AC own this 1¹/₂ acre lake containing mixed coarse fish. To fish obtain a Wellington AC book. Prospective members must live within a 10 mile radius of Louth. This book also allows fishing at Picks Bay, Martin Dales, Tattershall. For details contact Mr Foster, telephone 0507 602581. Season: Open all year (Picks Bay closed June 16th - March 14th).

21. OLSTEN FISHERY - Louth (TF 362842)

This 1/2 acre syndicate lake contains mixed coarse fish but predominantly tench and carp. Fishing is by day and season ticket, available from the house. Contact Mr Oliver, Mill Lane, Legbourne, Louth, telephone 0507 607432. Season: Open all year.


22. VICKERS POND -

Main Road, Saltfleetby, Louth (TF 423889)

A 11/2 acre lake containing tench, bream, carp and grass carp. Day tickets are available on site. Groundbait is not allowed and carp must not be kept in nets. Contact Mr Vickers on telephone 0507 338272. Season: Open all year.

23. WILLOW FARM - Louth (TF 432879)

Fishing on this mixed coarse fishery is by day ticket. These are available from the owner, Mr J Clark, Willow Farm, Great Carlton, Louth. Telephone 0507 338540. Season: Open all year.



24. ABY POND - Aby, Alford (TF 448862)

A 2 acre lake containing predominantly carp (to 28 lbs). Day tickets are available from Mr Harrop, telephone 0507 480225. Season: Open all year.

25. GRANGE FARM LEISURE LTD - Mablethorpe (TF 482837)

This new fishing complex consists of 3 coarse lakes, 2 trout lakes and 1 carp lake. Angling is limited to day tickets only, which are available on site. There is also a tackle and bait shop and cafe on site. Contact Grange Farm Leisure, Alford Road, Mablethorpe, telephone 0507 472814. Season: Open all year.

26. OHAM LAKE - Alford (TF 470824)

This 2 acre coarse fishery runs on a day ticket basis. There is a small tackle shop and toilets on site for anglers. Contact Mr C Beckenham, Maltby le Marsh, Alford. Season: Open all year.

27. WOODTHORPE LAKE -

Woodthorpe, Alford, Lincolnshire. (TF 445803)

A 1 acre lake containing rudd, tench, crucian carp and common carp. Day tickets are available from the machine by the shop. Details are available from Mrs Stubbs, telephone 0507 450294. Season: Open all year.

28. BELLEAU BRIDGE FARM LAKE -Belleau Bridge, Alford (TF 405779)

A 6 acre coarse fishery. Best bag weight of 1991 was 53lb of roach. Day tickets are available from the owner Mr Harrop, telephone 0507 480226. Season: Open all year.

29. TOTHBY LAKE -

Tothby Lane, Alford (TF 448762)

A 13/4 acre lake containing carp, roach, bream and tench. Owned by Alford Angling Club. Day tickets are available from the Club Secretary, Alan Fowley, telephone 0507 466116. Season: Open all year.

30. WINDMILL LAKE - Main Road, Alford (TF 457771)

A 31/2 acre lake containing mixed coarse fish. Leased by Grimsby Police Angling Club. Day tickets are available from the Club Secretary, Terry Holmes, telephone 0472 825354. Season: Open all year.

31. LAKESIDE CARAVAN PARK -Alford Road, Sutton-on-Sea (TF 504806)

This 4 acre lake containing roach, bream, tench, rudd and carp is situated within an attractive nature reserve. Day tickets are available on the bank. For further details contact Mr Hines, telephone 0507 441049. Season: Easter to October - other times by arrangement.

32. ASHBY PARK LAKES West Ashby, Horncastle (TF 251724)

Five lakes totalling 12 acres of mixed coarse fishing plus a 450m stretch of the River Bain (east bank) are available on this site. In 1991 the best bag weight was over 50lbs. Day tickets are available on the bank. There is a live bait ban and carp must not be kept in nets. All lakes have good access for disabled anglers. There is a caravan site with caravans to let (reduced rate fishing). Further details available from the owners R and M Francis, telephone 0507 527966. Season: Open all year.





33. BELLS YARD LAKE - Horncastle (TF 259700)

A 1/2 acre lake containing roach, bream, pike, perch, tench and rudd owned by Horncastle Angling Club. Season tickets only available from Syncro Sports, Horncastle. Members may also fish the Horncastle Canal - see Rivers section. Contact the Secretary Mr K Dunnatt, telephone 0507 527277. Season: Open all year. Close season tickets are available to those holding membership for 1 year or more.

34. REVESBY RESERVOIR AND THE WONG (TF 305634)

The 35 acre reservoir and 4 acre Wong are sited within the

grounds of the Revesby Estate. The reservoir is stocked with roach, tench, bream, perch, eels and pike and can be fished on day tickets between dawn and dusk only. The Wong is the syndicate fishery of the Wong Carp Anglers
Association and is stocked with common and mirror carp. More information is available from the Revesby Estate office, Revesby, Boston, telephone 0507 568395.
Season: June 16th - March 14th.

35. PARTNEY BRICK PIT - Minster Farm, Partney, Spilsby (TF 401694)

A 11/2 acre lake containing roach, perch, pike and bream. To fish obtain a Boston AA book which is available on the bank or from local tackle shops. The book covers all Boston Angling Association waters (see Rivers section). Contact Boston AA, telephone 0205 35088. Season: Open all year.

36. PEASGATE PIT Spilsby (TF 399645)

A 1¹/₂ acre lake containing roach, bream, tench and carp controlled by Spilsby Angling Association. Season and day tickets are available from local tackle shops.

37. HILL VIEW LAKES Skegness Road, Hogsthorpe, Chapel-St-Leonards (TF 538715)

Two lakes - a 2 acre trout lake and a ³/₄ acre coarse lake. Day tickets are available on the bank. Trout fishing is fly only. On the coarse lake barbless hooks must be used and boilies are not allowed. For details contact Mr K Raynor, telephone 0754 72979. Season: Open 28th March to 17th October.

38. LAKESIDE LEISURE PARK Trunch Lane, Chapel-StLeonards (TF 567703)

Two lakes of 3 acres and 1/2 an acre. Species include carp, roach, rudd, perch, dace, chub, tench, crucian carp and bream. Best fish in 1991 was a 33lb carp. Day tickets are available from the bank. Contact Mr Cook, telephone 0754 72631. Season: Open all year.

39. SKEGNESS WATER LEISURE PARK -Walls Lane Ingoldmells

Walls Lane, Ingoldmells (TF 569682)

This 7 acre lake contains roach, tench, perch, bream, golden orfe and carp.
Day tickets are available from the manager's office and night fishing is also available. Groundbait is not allowed. Contact Ellis Bros., telephone 0754 769019. Season: Open all year.

40. MILL ROAD FISHING LAKES, Skegness (TF 549677)

Two lakes totalling 3 acres. Containing stocks of mainly common and mirror carp, many into double figures. Roach, bream and tench are also present. Day tickets are available from the owner on site. Further information from Mr P Cumberworth, Mill Road, Addlethorpe, Skegness, telephone 0754 767586. Season: March to December.

41. SYCAMORE LAKES -

Skegness Road, Burgh-le-Marsh (TF 512646) This site consists of 3 lakes totalling 4 acres containing carp, tench, perch, roach, rudd and golden orfe. Carp to 19lbs have been caught. Eighty pegs are available, day

42. DENNIS RAINWATER LAKE -Low Road, Croft, Skegness (TF 534620)

A 1 acre lake containing carp, rudd and tench. Day tickets are available on the bank. Contact Mr or Mrs Dennis, telephone 0754 765783. Season: Open all year.

43. ROD AND LINE CARAVAN PARK -Lymn Bank East, Thorpe St Peter (TF 498615)

RIVER WELLAND

The Welland runs from Market
Harborough via Stamford and Spalding
to the Wash. The Fishing available can
be roughly divided into two areas and
types. Upstream of Market Deeping the
river is renowned for large winter
catches of chub and roach. Winter
matches held around Stamford have been
known to produce winning catches
upwards of 40lbs. During the warmer
months the river is fished by more
solitary anglers, catching large chub
from the weedy pools.

Downstream of Market Deeping the river is much wider with regular banks


and excellent access. The river is slow with populations of bream and roach. It is a popular match fishing venue as well as a popular tench and pike water.


Through Spalding town the fishing on the Welland itself is free although the Coronation Channel is a club water.




RIVER GLEN

Although it suffered badly from the effects of the drought during 1990 and '91 the lower end of the River Glen and the Bourne Eau can still produce good catches especially during winter when the weed has died down. Pike fishing is also good with fish caught on artificial and dead baits.








THE FENLAND DRAINS

The drains of south Lincs and north Cambs provide a wide variety of fishing all year round. On the drains around Spalding good roach and tench fishing is available during the summer with pike well into double figures caught when the cold weather arrives.


The South Holland System is known for bream catches into triple figures during matches and although there are problems with salinity at the lower end, the middle reaches produce excellent bags of roach and bream to those who can master the technique of fishing this fairly narrow drain. The North Level system is also a good match water and has excellent pike fishing. Fish to 30lb have been caught in 1992.



RIVER NENE

With its source west of Northampton the Nene runs north-east past Oundle toward Peterborough. The locks along the river mean that summer flows are sluggish and this particularly suits the roach and bream populations that flourish throughout the system. Upstream of Northampton, where fishing is let on a much more informal basis, and downstream of the numerous weir

pools, chub and dace are frequently caught. With the reintroduction of barbel to certain reaches they are sure to make an impact in the coming years. Big catches are made on seed baits during summer on the Oundle to Orton stretches of the river. During the winter the lower Nene fishes best as the levels drop after rain. Local tackle dealers and the angling press provide an invaluable source of information on stretches which are fishing well and where matches are booked.

The National Rivers Authority **Guardians of the Water Environment**

The National Rivers Authority is responsible for a wide range of regulatory and statutory duties connected with the water environment.

Created in 1989 under the Water Act it comprises a national policy body coordinating the activities of 8 regional groups each one mirroring an area(s) served by a former regional water authority.

The main functions of the NRA are:

Water resources

The planning of resources to meet the water needs of the country; licensing companies, organisations and individuals to abstract water; and monitoring the licences.

Environmental quality and Pollution Control

- maintaining and improving water quality in rivers, estuaries and coastal seas; granting consents for discharges to the water environment; monitoring water quality; pollution control.

Flood defence

the general supervision of flood defences; the carrying out of works on main rivers; sea defences.

Fisheries

the maintenance, improvement and development of fisheries in inland waters including licensing, re-stocking and enforcement functions.

Conservation

furthering the conservation of the water environment and protecting its amenity.

creation

navigation responsibilities in three regions -Anglian, Southern and Thames and the provision and maintenance of recreational facilities on rivers and waters under its control.
